A LETTER FROM MISS ROBYN

Dear Parents and Campers,

We hope you and your family are all well. We are so excited to offer Hume Lake summer camp again at Wagon Train because we love the kids and we love the experience that summer camp brings.

We love creating memories that fuel life-long relationships with your kids. Hume Lake Christian Camps is up at Kings Canyon National Park which offers a sleep-away, week-long, locked down camp for elementary kids.

Wagon Train is the section of the camp for elementary grade kids (3rd thru 6th Grade). Your student can be a camper if your student is entering 3rd grade to 6th grade in the Fall 2025.

This week-long camp will be from Sunday, July 13th to Saturday, July 19th. We are letting you know, way in advance so you may plan summers accordingly.

The cost of camp is \$800.

With fundraising this year, we are hoping to bring the price down to **\$400**. Stay tuned to a couple fundraising events we will have.

You will need a \$150 deposit with sign ups. The rest of the camp balance can be paid over-time and deadline will be in the beginning of May 2025.

Scholarships depend on when funds are available. There is a separate form for scholarships and are available in two forms, church scholarship or Hume campership.

Campership is a program by Hume Lake where independent donors sponsor kids to go to camp. If this is something you would be interested in, please indicate that on the sign-up sheet and I will relay the necessary information to you as it becomes available.

Lastly, we only have 16 spots for Wagon Train, please sign your student up as space is limited. If we need more spots, we may request it and be put on a waitlist.

I am so excited to bring another group of kids to Hume Lake Wagon Train and see how God can use camp to grow a deeper relationship with Him. If you have any questions, don't hesitate to email me at holcomb@cpchb.org.

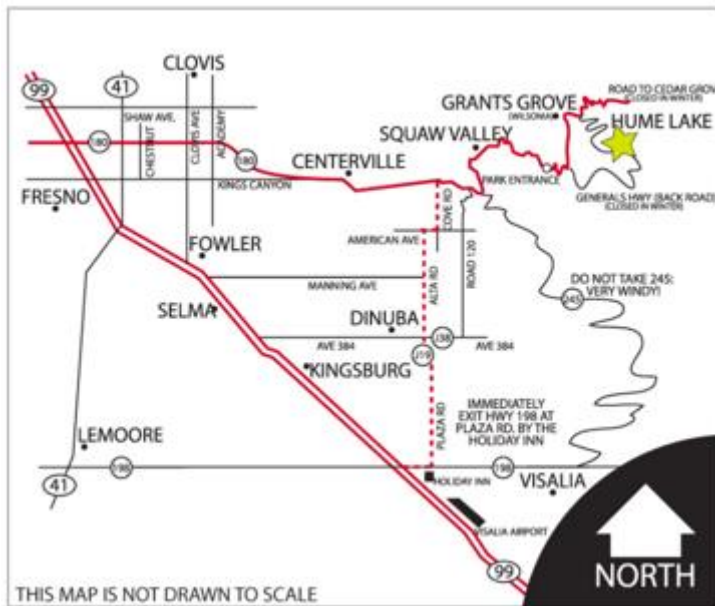

From Southern California

- Interstate 405, I-5, to CA-99.
- Head North on CA-99 for 96.6 mi
 - Merge onto CA-198 East
- Exit immediately on Plaza Dr. (Exit #102)
 - Turn left (north) on Plaza Dr.
- Plaza becomes Rd80/Alta Ave—Continue North
 - Turn Right (east) at E American Ave
 - Go 2.5 miles
 - Turn left (North) at Cove AVE
 - Turn right (East) at CA-180
 - Veer Right at Hume Lake Rd
 - Stay to the right
- Welcome to Hume Lake Christian Camps

Note: Most online mapping services will suggest you take the 245. It is a curvy, winding road that will take you at least an additional hour. **DO NOT TAKE 245.**

SUMMER REGISTRATION PROCEDURES AND POLICIES.

Deposits & Payment

A \$150 non-refundable, non-transferable deposit must accompany the Summer Camp Registration Form. The total cost of summer camp is **\$800**, but we are hoping to bring the price down to \$400 for every student.

Payments may be made on a schedule to help with budgets and provide flexibility for individual families but is not mandatory.

Standard Payment Schedule:

February-	\$150 Deposit
March-	\$75 Payment 1
April-	\$75 Payment 2
May-	\$100 Final payment



THE DEADLINE FOR ALL PAYMENTS AND FORMS IS **Thursday, May 1st.**

Refund Policy

The \$150 deposit is to reserve your space and is non-refundable and non-transferable. If your student cannot attend this year, this \$150 stays in their account and can be used for registration for the following year.

Scholarship Policy

Scholarships may be requested and dependent upon availability of funds. Normally each student can be awarded up to 20% of the total cost of camp. But we have had very generous individuals who wanted to invest in summer camp experiences for the kids. Scholarships are available for families who register early. Scholarship forms are available, please ask Robyn for the form. This form is due on March 1, 2025.

Forms Needed

- Summer Camp Registration Form (online, Christ Pacific Church Parent Release Form are required.)
- Christ Pacific Church Scholarship Form (if needed)
- *Hume Lake Consent and Release of Liability Form are also required (this is an online form provided by Hume approximately 3 weeks before camp).

Sleeping Arrangements

Students and their counselors will be sleeping in covered wagons. There will be a girls' wagon and a separate boys' wagon. Each bed has a personal shelf. There are 4 large areas underneath the wagons for extra storage. Each wagon has 2 leaders who have been background checked, fingerprinted and approved workers of Christ Pacific.



Care Packages: If you wish to send a care package (we suggest you do!) please bring them to the Christ Pacific Church office one week before camp (July 3rd). We will give them to the kids on Wednesday evening during the middle of the week. Most campers might feel home-sick and receiving a package midweek gives them extra encouragement for the week. Please make sure to label the package with their full name.



Departure: Students must arrive at the church parking lot for check-in by 6 am on Sunday July 13st. Please have your student(s) mark ALL their luggage and personal items with their name prior to check-in. Please put their sleeping bag and pillows in a trash bag with their names written on a piece of duct tape. I will email everyone that we got to camp as there is no cell reception up at Hume.

We will have a Health Screen before we depart done by a Registered Nurse.

Return: Students will arrive back at the church around 3 to 5 pm Saturday July 19th. If we are delayed or unexpectedly early, parents will be notified at the contact number specified on the Summer Camp Registration Form. We will text you as soon as we get reception around 12 noon Saturday and keep you updated on our ETA.

Money: The question always comes up, "How much money should I send with my student?". We recommend between \$20 for the lunch on the



drive up to Hume and lunch for drive on the way home. But while at camp, kids do not need to bring physical money.

Trading Post/Store takes place every day between 2-5pm. Campers may buy snacks or crafts. In Wagon Train, parents can just deposit money into their account.

On Day 4 Thursday, the camp partners with a mission organization and kids are asked if they'd like to donate money to missions; and sometimes kids give money from their accounts. Please talk with your student about this ahead of time.

Wagon Train Experience: You or your child may be wondering, what will camp be like. Wagon Train presents the gospel to the kids in an engaging and exciting way through the use of fun themes, energetic worship, morning prayer, daily wagon devotion time, daily skits and campfire worship at night. There are also high-energy, innovative games that give campers and counselors a chance to encourage team-building and allow lots of time for laughter and fun. There is also free time every day where kids get to partake in activities like ziplining, giant rope swings, kayaking, crafting, going to the pool, visiting the snack shop, relaxing and hanging out with friends, or participating in organized activities around camp. Each day there is also rec time, and during this time, campers participate in organized activities led by the counselors, such as repelling, archery, BB guns, hiking, crafts, playing a game called D&G (which is a combination of Hide and Seek and Dodge Ball – that is a favorite among the campers). Lastly, there is an all-camp water day, where all of the games and activities take place at the pool. All of the campers and counselors participate in water day. It is so much fun. Afterwards, we have a huge BBQ on the lawn. A week at camp can be life-changing; it has been for many students that we have taken up with us in past years! I hope you will consider sending your child up with us this year!

PACKING LIST:

WHAT TO PACK

Important: Bible, Water Bottle, Pen, Journal, Sunscreen, Chapstick, Bug spray, trash bag for dirty clothes

Bedding: Sleeping bag, pillow, twin bed sheet

Clothing: Pants, shorts, swim shorts/swimsuit (one piece), sweatshirt (hooded), t-shirts, dark/camo clothing for night game, shoes – regular use, shoes-to get wet, socks-bring extra, sandals-for pool and shower times, underclothes, hat, PJs*

(The best I had ever seen was a mom who packed pajamas in Ziploc bags for each night and labeled it “MONDAY PJ, TUES PJ, etc.)



Toiletries: Towel/Beach towel, soap/shampoo, personal hygiene, baby wipes

Other: Flashlight, batteries, disposable camera and batteries, road trip backpack with activities and snacks to keep them entertained on the long drive, small battery-powered lanterns

What NOT to pack:

NO Electronic Devices (NO cell phones, NO tablets, NO mp3 players, NO gaming consoles, NO Nintendo Switches)
NO fireworks
NO firearms

NO drugs
NO alcohol
NO tobacco/related products
NO knives
NO pets
NO water balloons

Medication/Special diet, other information/circumstances:

We want to make camp a peaceful and fun experience. What do I do if my kids take medication? There is a Registered Nurse stationed at Wagon Train. The *Hume Lake Consent and Release of Liability Form will tell you what to do with the medications.



For over-the-counter meds like painkillers, ibuprofen, and Tylenol, the Nurse has it stocked up at Hume. Please don't send them up with your kids.

For prescription medication, the *Hume Lake Consent and Release of Liability Form will have you fill it out and the when or how often your child needs to take them. **I will be personally bringing your child to the RN at the time of their medication.

If your child needs a shadow or an interventionist, please email Robyn.
If your child takes Dramamine for long drives, please email Robyn.

If you have a special diet, the *Hume Lake Consent and Release of Liability Form will have a place to fill it out. During mealtimes, there is an allergy line for kids with special diets. In the past there might be an added cost for special diets, more info to follow.
